2. Has any officer received 10 day or more suspension this quarter? If so, who and what for?

A. Officer [REDACTED] was suspended for 47 days, effective January 10, 2014. On October 26, 2013, Officer [REDACTED] was involved in a motor vehicle accident and arrested by the Stratford Police department. He was issued a summons for driving while intoxicated (39:4-50), careless driving (39:4-97) and DWI in a school crossing (39:4-50g2). Officer [REDACTED] provided two proper breath samples which reported his blood/alcohol content or BAC to be .09%.

B. Recruit [REDACTED] was dismissed from the Camden County Police Department, effective February 11, 2014. On May 13, 2013, Recruit [REDACTED] utilized the Department's computer system at the request of a civilian and disseminated information to a member of the public without the approval of the Chief of Police. Recruit [REDACTED] action were a direct violation of the rules and regulations of the Camden County Police Department; as she failed to report the violation to the Chief of Police through the chain of command or the Office of Internal Affairs.

C. Recruit [REDACTED] was dismissed from the Camden County Police Department, effective February 11, 2014. Recruit [REDACTED] did not meet the requirements of being a Camden County Police Officer and could not perform the duties as a police officer.

- D. Officer ██████████ was dismissed from the Camden County Police Department, effective February 17, 2014. On September 19, 2013, Officer ██████████ was arrested for operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol (39:4-50, ALOTEST 7110 MK 111-C with a reported blood/alcohol content or BAC of .19%. Officer ██████████ also received a summons for criminal mischief (2C:17-3A(1) by purposely and knowingly damaging tangible property belonging to Evesham Township Police Department.
- E. Recruit ██████████ was dismissed from the Camden County Police Department, effective March 18, 2014. On February 21, 2014, Command Staff was made aware of nightmares that Recruit ██████████ reported having. Recruit ██████████ described her nightmares as involving death and murder of a fellow recruit and she went to jail. On February 26, 2014 Recruit ██████████ was assessed by Dr. Jennifer Kelly and it was determined that she was unfit for duty.

2. Has any officer received 10 day or more suspension this quarter? If so, who and what for?

A. All charges against Officer [REDACTED] were sustained and he was dismissed on May 6, 2014. On May 10, 2013, Officer [REDACTED] provided Pennsauken Township Police Department with a pre-employment urine specimen that proved positive for boldione, a prohibited substance. On April 23, 2014, Officer [REDACTED] had an administrative hearing where all charges were sustained.

B. Officer [REDACTED] was suspended without pay on February 11, 2014 for 5 months as per a settlement agreement agreed upon by all parties. On Friday, February 7, 2014 at approximately 0506 hours, Officer [REDACTED] was observed asleep at the wheel of his vehicle. Upon arrival to the location, Howell Township Police attempted to wake him. However, in the interim he rolled into the rear of their police vehicle. The officers relate that Officer [REDACTED] smelled of an alcoholic beverage and when asked to submit to a breathalyzer test, he refused.

At the Scene

On Thursday September 19, 2013, at 01:26 a.m., I responded priority 1 to Route 70 at Greenbrook Drive, for a vehicle off the roadway into a ditch and had struck several trees. Upon arrival, I observed a silver Honda Civic, bearing New Jersey Registration NJ- [REDACTED]. The silver Honda was facing eastbound, off the roadway, into a ditch, and had struck several trees on the front passenger's side of the vehicle. The vehicle's lights were still on and a white male was standing near the vehicle on the roadway. I pulled behind a white Enterprise Van that was parked on the shoulder of roadway. Two white males, later identified as Tim Ersek and Brandon Brennan, exited the white van and stated they observed the crash and helped the white male from the driver's seat of the vehicle. Ersek stated the white male appears to 'OK,' and is standing in the roadway next to his vehicle. Ersek also stated that the white male was the only person in the vehicle. I immediately checked on the white male who had a minor bloody nose. I asked the white male if he had any serious injuries, the white male state, 'no,' just a minor nose bleed. I contacted Central Communications to have the Evesham Emergency Medical Service continue in to evaluate the white male. I asked the white male for his documents. The white male handed me his New Jersey Driver's License and his Camden City Metro Police Identification Card which identified him as Travis G. Hoban. I asked Hoban what happen. Hoban stated that he lost control of his vehicle after a vehicle passed him. As I was speaking with Hoban, I smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. Hoban's speech was slow and slurred, his eyes were blood shot, and eye lids were droopy. Hoban's hand movements were slow and fumbling. I asked Hoban how much he had to drink tonight. Hoban stated that he had a couple of beers tonight.

Evesham Emergency Medical Service arrival and evaluated Hoban who refused any further medical treatment. I asked the two witnesses,



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Ersek and Brennan what happen while Hoban was being evaluated. Ersek and Brennan stated that they were traveling eastbound on Rotue70 behind the silver Honda and observed the silver Honda drift over the double yellow lines into the westbound lane of Route 70 crossing the westbound fog line with the driver side tires. Then the Honda swerved back to the right lane crossing the double yellow lines and ran off the roadway into a ditch and stopped after hitting the trees. Ersek and Brennan stated they pulled over to assist the white male driver, (later identified as Hoban) out of his vehicle and called 911. Ersek and Brennan indicated to me that they smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Hoban`s breath while they assisted him from the silver Honda.

I asked Hoban to perform the Evesham Police Standardized Field Sobriety Tests in front of my marked patrol vehicle number #1004. The tests were conducted in a safe area in front of my patrol vehicle on Route70. The roadway surface was blacktop, flat and level, free of debris, and illuminated by my patrol vehicle and streetlights. I asked Hoban if he had any prosthetic limbs or injuries that would prevent him from performing the tests. Hoban stated that he does did not have any prosthetic limbs or injuries and could perform the tests.

The first test given was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test. I detected lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, distinct Nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes, and Nystagmus onset before 45 degrees in both eyes. I detected six out of six Nystagmus hits from this test.

The second test given was the Heel to Toe, Walk and Turn Test. I explained and demonstrated the test that consists of placing one foot in front of the other, counting each step, stepping nine steps forward, turn around with four small steps, and nine return steps back in a straight line. Hoban stated he understood and could perform the test. Hoban missed heel-toe several times, stepping off the line, raising his arms, and had difficulty keeping his balance. Hoban did not count out loud as he was instructed. Hoban only took seven steps forward and eight steps back and did not count aloud as he was instructed. Hoban could not perform the test as he was instructed.

The third test given was the One Leg Stand Test. I explained and demonstrated the test that consists of placing one foot six inches off the ground while counting to thirty with your arms at your side. Hoban stated he understood and could perform the test. Hoban put his foot down several times, was swaying and hopping, and using his arms for balance, and was instructed to continue the test for thirty seconds. Hoban did not continue the count where he stopped after placed his foot down as he was instructed. Hoban could not perform the test as he was instructed.

As a result of these tests, along with the operation of his vehicle, an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath, and his physical impairment, formed the basis for my probable cause to believe that Hoban operated his vehicle under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Hoban was arrested, handcuffed (double locked), and placed into the rear seat of my patrol vehicle# 1004. Hoban was searched incident to arrest with negative findings. Officer Carlin # 116, stood by for Eagle Towing to impound Hoban's Vehicle, for the twelve hour mandatory hold.

En Route to Headquarters

While transporting Hoban to headquarters with the windows up, I smelled an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the back seat of my vehicle that was not there prior to placing Hoban into my vehicle. I read Hoban his Miranda Warnings prior to arriving at headquarters.

At the Station

I escorted Hoban from my patrol vehicle to the booking area. I checked Hoban's mouth at 02:05 a.m., for any foreign objects to begin the twenty minute wait period, prior to taking breath samples. I had Hoban open his mouth and lift up his tongue to ensure that his mouth was free of any foreign objects. All portable radios, mic packs, and cell phones, were removed from the booking area prior to testing. I read the Division of Motor Vehicle Standard Statement Form to Hoban. I asked Hoban if he would submit to giving breath samples. Hoban stated, 'Yes,' he would give breath samples. Prior to conducting each

breath test I read the following instructions to Hoban, 'I want you to take a deep breath. Continue to blow into the mouth piece with one long continuous breath. Continue to blow until I tell you to stop. A new mouth piece was used for each breath test. I contacted Central P-5, to complete the Tolerance Calculations, to ensure a good breath sample reading was taken. Central P-5, advised me that these breath samples were within the Accepted Tolerance Levels. The Alcotest was completed with a result of .19% BAC respectfully. After Hoban was processed he was placed into Cell #3 while he waits for his Mother to arrive from Bayville New Jersey. While Hoban was in Cell #3, he was observed urinating on the bench and floor by Officer Scambia #96. See Case 13-19452 for this incident and additional charge.

Hoban was issued the following three summonses:

39:4-50 Driving While Intoxicated

39:4-96 Reckless Driving

39:4-97 Careless Driving

The digital video from vehicle #1004 was downloaded. The Miranda Warning Card was placed into evidence locker #3 and a Property Description Form was completed. A New Jersey Driver Abstract Form was completed and forwarded to the Motor Vehicle Commission. A Subpoena Form was completed and forwarded to the Evesham Municipal Court along with all Driving While Intoxicated Forms for the Case File. Hoban was released to his Mother, Karen Hoban, who signed the Potential Liability Form at 04:50 a.m., Hoban was given her copy of the Potential Liability Form.

This case is closed pending a court appearance.

On Thursday September 19, 2013, at 01:53 a.m., Travis Hoban was arrested for Diving While Intoxicated after a single motor vehicle collision investigation. Hoban was brought back to headquarters for processing. Once Hoban was finished being processed he was placed into Cell #3 in the booking area.
