Please be advised that on or about March 28, 2012, Frenchtown Borough Police Chief Allan Kurylka requested my office conduct an investigation concerning an allegation of official misconduct by Joint Court of Delaware Valley Municipal Prosecutor Mary Mott for her handling of a speeding ticket issued to one of her employees, Mr. Thomas Spork. The Court found Mr. Spork "not guilty" based on Prosecutor Mott's representation on the "Request to Approve Plea Agreement," that there was a "problem with discovery per officer." Chief Kurylka disputes this representation.

My office conducted a thorough investigation and determined there was insufficient evidence to support any criminal charges. However, because Mr. Spork was employed by Kocisis Farms, was driving a vehicle registered to Kocisis Farms at the time of the ticketed motor vehicle stop, and Kocisis Farms is Ms. Mott's family-owned farm, Ms. Mott may have engaged in ethical violations by handling Mr. Spork's municipal matter, and in making the discovery representation to the Court. Accordingly, my office is notifying you of our investigation and will make our file available to you at your request.

While our criminal investigation was proceeding, Ms. Mott agreed with my office's request that she refrain from serving as a Municipal Prosecutor, and Assistant Prosecutors from my office served as the tempdrary Municipal Prosecutor. However, now that the criminal investigation is completed, we have recommended to the involved townships covered by Ms. Mott, that Ms. Mott continue to refrain from serving as a Municipal Court prosecutor during the pendency of the OAE's investigation; but, have informed them that my office will no longer serve as a temporary municipal prosecutor.

Dear Mr. Sweeny:

I am the Municipal Prosecutor of the Joint Court of the Delaware Valley, a Joint Municipal Court of the Borough of Frenchtown and the Townships of Holland and Alexandria.

I dismissed a speeding ticket with the approval of the Officer who wrote the ticket. I also happen to "know" the Defendant, thus the basis of the complaint.

But I did not, nor did I ever have the intention to do anything improper by this dismissal. This whole matter is simply a case of not thinking about how it "appeared". I.e. I failed to recognize a potential conflict of interest, but this failure was totally unintentional.

The ticket was a speeding ticket for going 30 miles a hour in a 25 mile an hour zone. Officer Johnson had allegedly "clocked" the Defendant going 42 miles an hour but wrote the ticket for 30 in a 25 instead. Unfortunately Officer Johnson, when he wrote out the ticket also put a big 42 on the front of the ticket with a circle around it. This creates a problem with the summons in how it was written.

The Defendant, Thomas Spork, was a young man who works for my husband's farming operation, Kocsis Farms, LLC. (Admittedly I own 49% of the business, but my only involvement in the business is to do the bookkeeping. My husband makes all of the day to day decisions and deals with the employees.) Kocsis Farms, LLC has 7 or so full time and seasonal employees as well as my husband. Kocsis Farms, LLC is a cash grain operation, farming about 3000 acres in Hunterdon County.

The ticket was issued sometime in late January. On February 8th Tom first told me that he had gotten the ticket. I told him at that time that it was a two point violation and that my advice to him was to simply pay the ticket and then to take the on line defensive driving classes offered by DMV to then lose the two points. I told Tom that if he wanted to, he could schedule the matter with the officer in court, but that as far as I was concerned, he should simply pay the ticket and take the class.

After this conversation, Tom then called the Court and asked them to schedule the matter with the officer for Court. (See attached copy of the message book from the Court regarding

that phone call.)

The obvious point is that if I had the intention of doing something inappropriate in dismissing the ticket, why would I have advised Tom to have the matter scheduled in Court with the officer? If it had been my intention to do something inappropriate in dismissing the ticket, it would have been easier to have done so without the officer present.

At this court, I sit in a small back room and see the defendants one at a time and try to resolve matters. We use plea sheets in this court and if a matter is resolved, the sheet is filled out and the Defendant goes up to the Judge to put the resolution through on the record while I remain in the back room, trying to work out the next matter. In any given day, I will see upwards of 40 different defendants and attorneys, often more, and it is a hectic, fast paced court. The Defendants would be lined up outside of the room and I attempt to move along the calendar as effectively and efficiently as possible. The day this matter was scheduled was a "double session" for the court since we had to reschedule one of the sessions that month. (Normally this is a court with two sessions a month.) Therefore it was an especially busy court session.

On this particular day, Officer Johnson as well as the Chief of Police were in this back room when Tom came in with his ticket. In discussing this matter, the Chief started to grumble and when I asked the Chief if he had a problem with the dismal he said "I guess not". So I filled out the plea sheet to dismiss the ticket and Tom left the room. My whole interaction on this matter that day took about 3 to 4 minutes, about the same time I spend with each Defendant. I wish to note that while this matter had been specifically scheduled with the officer, Officer Johnson failed to bring his "discovery" with him to court and was unprepared.

I make it my practice and have the reputation of treating everyone in the Court the same way, regardless of who they are. I don't "play games". Period. One reason I live by this practice is that prosecuting in a small community in which one lives and is active results in many Defendants believing that since they somehow "know" you, they deserve special treatment. So I make it clear that I treat everyone the same way, regardless of who they are, which makes my interaction with people, both inside and outside of court, easier.

I can assure you I did not dismiss this ticket because this kid worked for my husband. I just did not think about how it looked in the few moments in which I was dealing with this dismissal on a very busy court day.

And I would also like to say that even though Tom works for my husband, my feeling is "so what"? He is not a friend. We do not socialize together and honestly, he is not even the best of employees. He is just a kid who works for my husband. Nothing special.

I note that from his letter that the County Prosecutor felt that there was an additional problem in so far as that Tom was driving a vehicle registered to Kocsis Farms, LLC at the time of the violation. With respect to that, I did not even realize that fact until the County Prosecutor raised that issue. As a Prosecutor, when I look at a speeding ticket, I look at two things, the speed the Defendant was going and the location of the violation. That's all I care about. I never look at the vehicle information since it is totally irrelevant to me. So I never realized he was driving one of Kocsis Farms' trucks. Furthermore, Kocsis Farms owns probably close to 20 different trucks, (from pick up trucks to flat bed, dump trucks and tractor-trailers) and Tom operates any and all of them at any time during the work day. It was not as if Tom was driving my personal vehicle!

I would have to admit that I have had some difficulties with this particular Chief of

Police for some time since I refuse to do things that he wishes to have done which I feel are inappropriate or unacceptable. In fact, this past January this Chief went to his Mayor in an attempt to have me not reappointed to this court, but I was reappointed anyway. Thus you can understand the nature of the relationship between us. But I have never felt it was my job as a municipal prosecutor to be the puppet of the police department. So what happened here is that while the Chief approved the dismissal at the time, he used the apparent "conflict of interest" to complain to the County Prosecutor, again, I feel, in an attempt to get me removed from the court so that he can find a replacement more suitable to his manner of doing business.

So all this really is a mountain made out of a mole hill because of political reasons.

I did not dismiss the ticket because the Defendant worked for my husband's company!


I just did not think about how it appeared (or more so, how the Chief was able to make it appear, which I think is the real point here) in the few minutes that I dealt with this matter in Court that day.
