Dear Ms. Childs;

First and foremost I would like to thank you for your time and attention to this matter. In addition I would like to respond to the information which has been forwarded to your office.

I see a copy of a letter that was e-mailed to me from Mr. Sach's office. This is the first time I am seeing this letter. I sent Mr. Sach's a certified letter informing him that I would be contacting the Ethics Committee if I did not hear from him. I did receive a call after that from Eve, his secretary. She stated he would be sending a letter to which I was perfectly willing to wait for. However, I said there would have to be a timeframe, two weeks. I would not wait indefinitely again. I never heard from his office again and I never saw that letter until it was forwarded to me from your office. I invite you to search my computer; I did not get that letter. When I did not hear from his office I generated a letter to the Ethics Committee.


Mr. Sach's told me at the time of closing of the property mentioned in the complaint; that he would have to hold \$9350 for a \$4000 lien for a medical bill. He said he could probably settle for a couple thousand dollars and forward the remainder of the balance to me within three months. I have called his office repeatedly over the past five years to no avail.

I see also in his response that there were two liens in different amount and they were not settled by him but by the title company. In addition I see that \$2040.98 was paid to the title company for dispersing these funds, which seems extremely high. I do see a typed statement, but no proof that this is actually how the funds were disbursed.

I am very disturbed by having to go to such extremes to resolve this issue. I simply wanted to know who was paid, how much and what was left. I don't think it is asking too much of an attorney who was holding \$9350 of your money for a lien that I was told amounted to approximately \$4000. I called repeatedly and was dismissed each time and that I believe is unethical practice by an attorney who is supposedly representing you.

Again I thank you for your attention to this matter.
